Arthur Rank Hospice Charity



Money raised by the Arthur Rank Hospice Charity goes directly to support the work of Arthur Rank House which is an adult hospice offering specialist palliative end of life care to patients over the age of 18, living in Cambridge and surrounding areas.

Our funds pay for things such as bereavement counselling, complementary therapy, day therapy, management and support of over 250 volunteers, Hospice at Home service and much more.

It is not just the patients themselves who benefit from this

help, as support is also provided to their families and carers who are usually under pressure at such times.

We aim to raise in excess of £1 million a year to fund these services and our strategic objectives.

The Blue Cross is dedicated to improving the lives of sick and unwanted pets. It takes in and finds loving new homes for thousands of homeless animals every year and treats many more whose owners can't afford private vet fees.

We have a network of 11 adoption centres, 4 animal hospitals and 3 equine centres across the UK.

Our Cambridge adoption centre was opened in 1935 and serves Cambridgeshire and parts of Norfolk, Suffolk, Essex, Hertfordshire, Bedfordshire and Northamptonshire, in a radius of around 30 miles.

Our facilities can accommodate 150 cats and some rabbits, and we re-home hundreds of animals every year.
